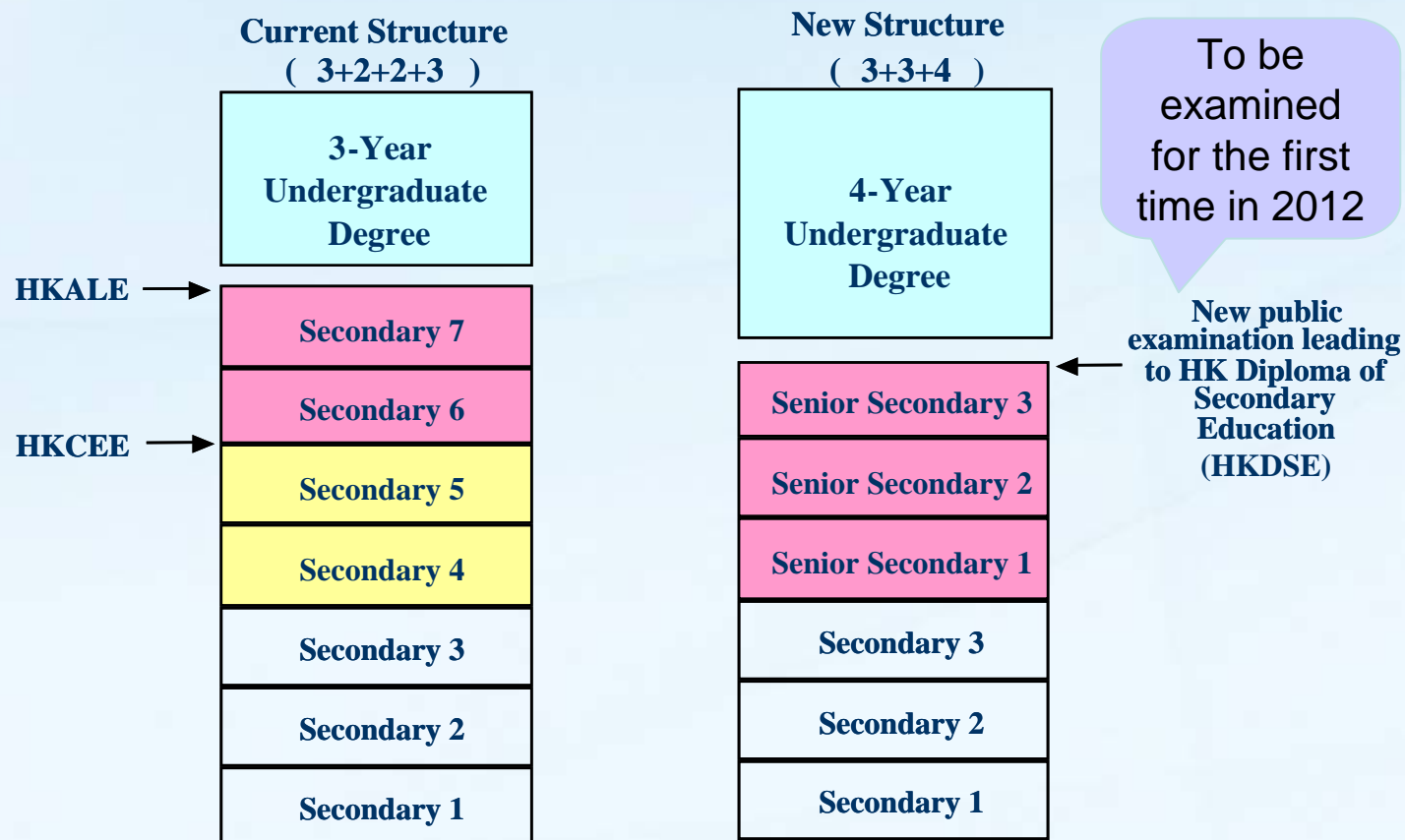


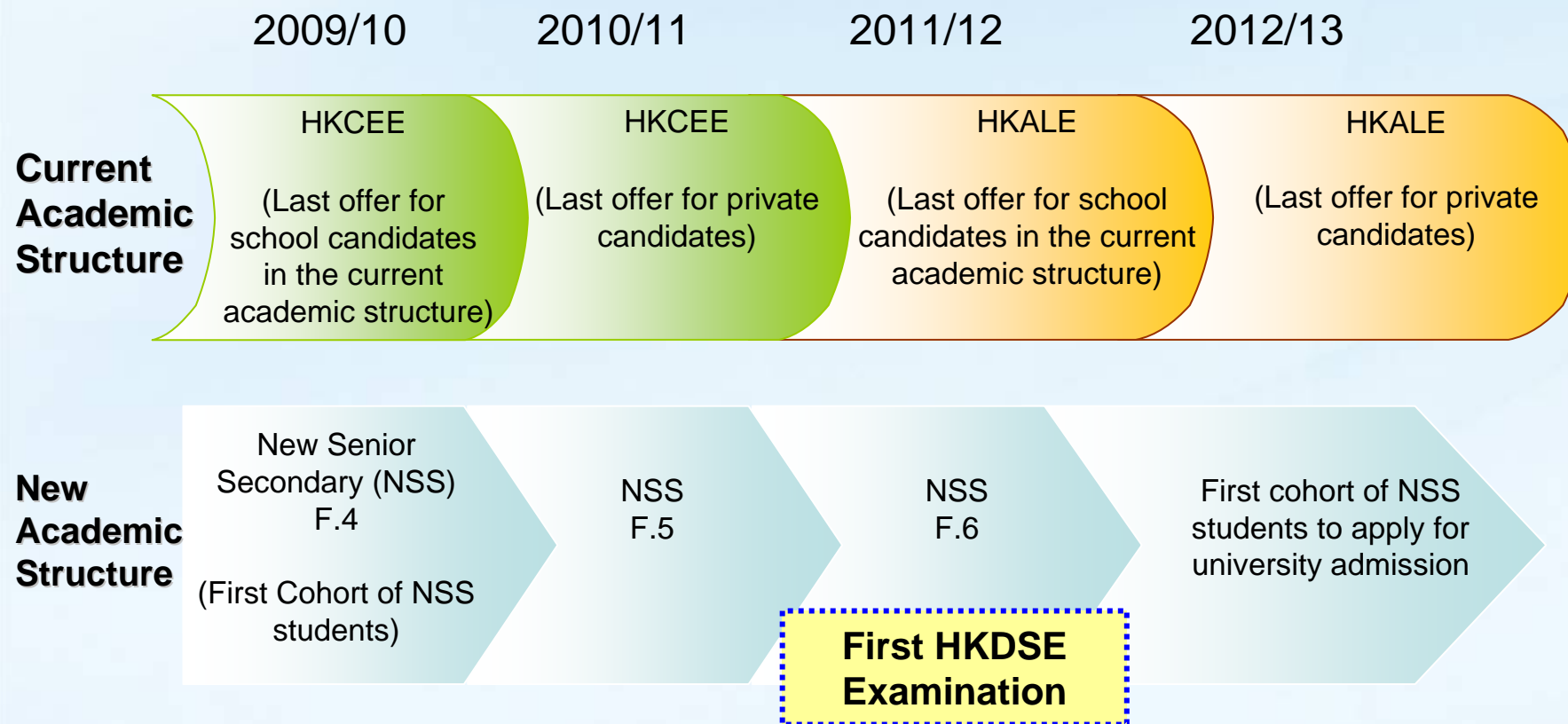

NSS Subjects

- Candidates may take up to a maximum of eight subjects from Categories A, B or C.
- For candidates choosing eight subjects, at least one of the subjects chosen must come from the following areas:
 - Ethics and Religious Studies/Music/Physical Education/Visual Arts in Category A
 - Applied Learning subjects in Category B
 - Other language subjects in Category C



Standards-referenced Reporting (SRR)

Category A: 24 NSS Subjects



Standards-referenced reporting (SRR)

- Results will be reported in 5 levels(1-5), of which 5 is the highest and 1 the lowest. Level 5 candidates with the best performance will be awarded 5**, and the next top Level 5 candidates will be awarded 5*. Performance below Level 1 will be indicated as “Unclassified”
- Level descriptors and exemplars are provided from Level 1 – Level 5



Standards-referenced reporting (SRR)

- Greater transparency
- Standards remain constant over time
- Level descriptors spell out the standards required for different levels of performance
- More information to students and teachers on how to improve learning and teaching

Standards of the HKDSE

- The purpose of the design of assessment system is to capture the full range of achievement of candidates
- Levels 4 and 5 will be set with reference to the standards of Grades A-D in HKALE
- Reporting with reference to standards that remain constant over time
- Percentages of different levels awarded depend on the performance of candidates
- More information to tertiary institutions for selection
- Provide information to employers for selecting suitable employees
- Alignment with international best practice



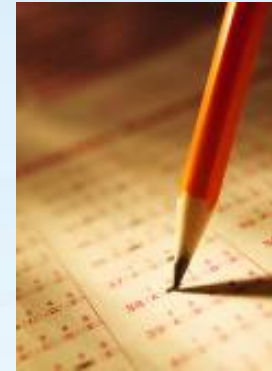
HKDSE: Certification & Selection

- To provide general qualification to S6 graduates for further education, employment and training



HKDSE: Public Examinations

- Written Papers
 - M.C., constructed response questions, essays



- Listening and Speaking Tests
 - for language subjects only

School-based Assessment (SBA)

- Typically contributes about 20% of subject marks
- Assessment areas include those which are not covered by written papers e.g. an independent enquiry study for the subject of Liberal Studies, laboratory skills for science subjects
- Conducted in S5 and S6 by subject teachers during the course of learning and teaching
- Implemented in 12 subjects in 2012 HKDSE, gradually extended to other subjects from 2014 HKDSE onward



Issues related to implementing SBA

Plagiarism	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Guidance and supervision by subject teachers• Students required to do most of the work in class
Fairness	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Assessment guidelines/criteria• Within- / inter- school standardisation• Moderation by the HKEAA
Assessment Tasks	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• SBA Teachers' Handbooks• Assessment requirements and sample assessment tasks available to schools



Double Cohort Year (2012)

- HKALE candidates → study 3-year degree programme
- HKDSE candidates → study 4-year degree programme
- 14,500 university places for each cohort



Local Recognition of HKDSE

Universities

- May 2005
- Heads of Universities Committee (HUCOM) issued a statement to confirm its support for all the 4 core subjects to be considered as mandatory minimum requirements for university entrance
- Level 3 for Chi and Eng
- Level 2 for Maths and LS



Local Recognition of HKDSE

- July 2006:
 - Universities announced specific requirements for admission to individual faculties/departments
 - In addition to the 4 core subjects, most universities will include one elective in their entrance requirements and in some cases, a second elective from a wider group of subjects
- Oct 2008:
 - HUCOM confirmed that the Student Learning Profile (學生學習概覽) of NSS students will be considered as a good reference document in the university admission process

Local Recognition of HKDSE

Employers

- Discussion with Civil Service Bureau (CSB) on the relevant requirements for different positions is underway
- Introduction of the HKDSE qualification to employers in different trades and professions



International Recognition of HKDSE

- To ensure the international recognition of the HKDSE qualification, the HKEAA has been holding discussions with international agencies and conducting benchmarking and comparability research studies on HKDSE
 - Cambridge International Examinations (CIE)
 - National Recognition Information Centre (NARIC) in the UK
 - Universities and Colleges Admissions Services (UCAS) in the UK
 - Australian Education International (AEI) in Australia
 - Other universities overseas
