Preface

Purpose of Booklet

As a close partner with schools, the Curriculum Development Institute (CDI) has systematically organised a series of Professional Development Programmes (PDPs) on curriculum development for principals and teachers. The purposes are to help them achieve personal learning goals, gain professional knowledge, develop pedagogical and leadership skills suited to the needs of their students and contexts of their schools.

To enable schools to plan and co-ordinate the professional development of teachers at the school level for the 2008/09 school year, CDI has prepared this booklet on *Professional Development Programmes for Secondary School Principals and Teachers*. The details are also available at the website: <http://www.edb.gov.hk/cd/pdp/sec>. The programme information on the web will be revised or updated in response to changing needs and circumstances.

Design & Focus of Programmes

The design of the programmes aims to sustain the curriculum reform introduced since 2001/02. It has considered the areas requiring greater emphasis, further capacity building, and schools' responses received from the questionnaire survey on training needs of the New

Senior Secondary (NSS) Curriculum in 2008/09 and other channels. The PDPs to be offered in this school year focus on the following:

- i) Teacher preparation for NSS subjects in four identified areas, namely (a) Understanding and Interpreting the Curriculum; (b) Assessing Student Learning; (c) Learning and Teaching Strategies; and (d) Enriching Knowledge;
- ii) Learning and teaching strategies especially those promoting reading across the curriculum, assessment for learning, catering for learner diversity, managing interface issues, strengthening leadership and management for effective implementation;
- iii) Thematic series related to Moral and Civic Education (e.g. “My Pledge to Act”), national education (e.g. “60th National Anniversary”) and career development (e.g. “Changing Career World”); and
- iv) Brief information in the annex on student activities provided by different organisations which will facilitate schools' early planning of student learning activities in the 2008/09 school year and the promotion of Life-wide Learning in schools.

Organisation of Booklet

PDPs in this booklet are organised under four broad categories: (A) Programmes for New Senior Secondary (NSS) Curriculum and Assessment; (B) Programmes on Management and Leadership; (C) Programmes for Sustaining Curriculum and Assessment Reform, and (D) Programmes on Induction, all of which include a variety of programmes on the curriculum emphases, learning and teaching strategies for the various curriculum areas and courses for specific groups of school personnel (e.g. new panel chairpersons, new teachers, librarians, laboratory technicians). Each programme is indicated in its title whether it is a “new”, “re-run” (programme content identical or with minor adaptations) or “refreshed” (programme content with more than half updates) event. Principals, teachers and other members of staff may quickly identify programmes that may interest them through searching the first three columns of the tables which indicate the theme, the target group and the title of the programmes.

The professional development opportunities offered by the programmes are desirably complemented by teachers’ learning by doing in real classroom and school settings, collaborative learning amongst teachers in schools as learning communities, and other forms of professional learning.
