

## Health Management and Social Care

### Why do you need to study Health Management and Social Care (HMSC)?

Emerging health & social care issues and concerns in Hong Kong and around the world are posing new challenges to youngsters. HMSC students will be better prepared to meet these challenges if they are equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills in maintaining and promoting good health and well-being.

### What will you learn from HMSC?

HMSC is aimed at nurturing students to become healthy and responsible citizens, and contribute to building up a caring and harmonious society. Students will carry out 'field learning' to strengthen their problem solving skills and apply the theories learnt in classrooms. The curriculum structure of the subject is as follows:

### How will you be assessed in HMSC?

The public assessment of HMSC consists of public examination and School-based Assessment (SBA). The SBA is deferred to 2019. The public examination results constitute 100% of the final subject results. The following table outlines the components of the public examination:

Component		Weighting	Duration
Paper 1 (Compulsory Part)	Section A: Short questions (compulsory) Section B: Structured questions (compulsory)	57%	2 hours
Paper 2 (Compulsory and Elective Parts)	Section A: Short questions (compulsory) Section B: Issue-based questions (choice of questions will be provided)	43%	1 hour 45 minutes
